NORTH & MIDDLE LITTLETON PARISH COUNCIL

Dogs on leads: All parishioners/dog walkers are requested to have their dogs on a lead when using public footpaths. It has been reported that there have been occasions recently when dogs have not been under control and are encroaching on private land. Dogs must also be kept on a lead when near livestock or wild animals. Only people who can fully control a dog should walk it.

VA Signs: These are now in place but unfortunately drivers are not respecting this warning on Cleeve Road.

Parking - School Lane: This remains a problem. Where possible parishioners are requested to park at the rear of School Lane to enable emergency/large vehicles to negotiate School Lane.

Overgrown vegetation: We are once again at the time of year when hedges/brambles encroach on our footpaths and roads. Please can all residents check both sides of their hedges – inside and outside their gardens – and cut the overgrowth back.

Trees: A survey has taken place on the condition of trees in the ownership of the parish council. Some of these require work to be carried out in the near future.

Verge Grips: These require clearing. It is proposed to have this work completed before the winter.

Bus Shelter - North Littleton Crossroads: Following the latest damage this has now been removed for safety reasons and will not be replaced.

Street Lighting: As the parish is now part of the Worcestershire County Council lighting initiative, any street lighting issues can be reported direct to them. Either telephone 01905 763763 or the fault can be reported online via the county council website. The other alternative is to contact the clerk with the details of the fault and position of lamp.

New Speed Limits in Place

Data from our new Vehicle Activated Signs (VAS) has been passed to Worcestershire County Council (WCC), who will work with the police to monitor any concerning speed patterns.

Loved and valued – a letter from Trevor Burton

I often walk around our village pushing my granddaughter in her buggy. Sometimes she walks and is quite determined to go 'that way'. We often meet other people and my granddaughter loves to say 'Morning'. One day while we were out her shoelace came undone and she tripped over it. Whilst consoling her, a lovely young mum came along and did the shoelaces up.

There is a Fare Share shed in Badsey where food is dropped off. Occasionally, I have the privilege of collecting the food. I am grateful for those who help me unload my car. People come to the shed and conversations start. One Friday, I had not put the food out, and I saw someone with several empty bags walking away, rather sad. My thoughts weren't very nice towards him but God spoke to me and challenged me to run after him and let him know that I was about to put the food out. At the shed, he opened up and told me why he needed the food. This made me see him in a different light.

Once a month I work the night time economy in Evesham as a Street Pastor. Some people go out for enjoyment others have no choice but to be out. Occasionally, because of the nature of the environment, incidents happen and we engage and help people. Subsequently we are thanked and people share their situations. As Street Pastors we go out there because we value those we see on the streets. As a result they often allow us to pray with them.

Badsey church uses their building to run a Stay and Play 'Drop in' every Monday during term time with toys, music (and a free cuppa). It is wonderful to see grandparents, mums and dads coming along with

their children. It gives them the opportunity to get out of the house. My granddaughter has changed so much, interacting with the other children. The children and grandparents (and parents) are valued, and the adults receive support when they share their struggles.

I often walk around the village praying. I meet and have conversations with people. Whilst praying I was challenged by God to write this article. You may not believe in God. There was a time I didn't, however, I have faced tough situations in my life but I can testify how God has stepped into my life and revealed to me His love for me in tangible ways. This has happened especially after allowing someone to pray with me.

On Wednesdays at Badsey church we have a churchyard group from 10am. It doesn't matter if you're not into gardening, it is a time for meeting others to chat and share. There are a lot of issues going on in the world, and political challenges for us in this country. We all face upheavals in our lives and we grieve and struggle dealing with these issues. You are welcome to come along to talk to others about these or anything else over a coffee. We are a bunch of ordinary imperfect people who value each other and love to spend time with each other. It is a hub for connection, reflection and shared experiences. If you need it, some of us are happy to offer support and pray with you.
